Foundations Program (Monday, Wednesday, Friday)

This part-time program provides students with a well-rounded, faith-centered education, focusing on core academic subjects and spiritual formation. Designed to complement a student's learning journey, this program nurtures both intellectual growth and personal development.

Courses Offered:

English Language Foundations – Focusing on grammar, writing, and language structure to strengthen communication and literacy.

Mathematics – Building a solid foundation in numeracy, problem-solving, and critical thinking.

Fondations de la langue française – Enhancing French language proficiency through structured grammaire and dictée (dictation exercises).

Theology – Rooted in Catholic teachings, this aspect of the program includes stewardship and service, participation in Mass, and deepening understanding of the Catechism.

 *Physical Education* – Encouraging health, teamwork, and physical well-being through structured activities and sports.

This program is designed to complement homeschooling in a flexible, yet structured academic experience that **integrates Catholic values, strong academics, and character formation** in a supportive learning environment.

The Humanities Program (Tuesday, Thursday)

This part-time program offers students a dynamic, faith-centered educational experience that nurtures both academic growth and spiritual formation. Rooted in Catholic values, the program integrates project-based learning (PBLs), hands-on experiences, and meaningful community engagement.

Courses Offered:

Études Sociales – Exploring history and geography from a Catholic worldview.

French & English Language Studies – Enhancing communication skills in both English and French through literature and spelling.

Fine Arts – Cultivating creativity and expressing faith through all four art strands (Music, Visual Arts, Theatre, Dance).

The ASM Junior High Program: Igniting Minds and the Path to Independent Thinking

The Junior High Program for Grades 6-8 is designed to cultivate independence, critical thinking, and community engagement among students. Through this program, students begin to explore independent studies, which allows them to develop self-directed learning skills. At the core of this program is the belief that students should be active participants in their learning journey. Socratic discussions are a teaching component, encouraging students to engage in thoughtful dialogue, ask probing questions, and develop deeper understanding through collaborative work with other students. Math is studied as a guided independent program, enabling students to work at their own pace with support from the teacher. Additionally, the science program, provides a solid foundation for future sciences in high school. Teachers set expectations for students to complete homework, which reinforces and extends the learning done in the classroom.

The program also emphasizes community involvement, encouraging students to participate in school initiatives, volunteer activities, and service projects. This approach fosters an educational experience, preparing students for the ASM high school program.

How can I help my junior high child?

Navigating the middle school can be an adventure! Here are some tips to help you guide your child through this exciting time:

- 1. Foster Critical Thinking:** Instead of giving them the answers, ask your child thought-provoking questions when they're stuck or seeking clarity. Encourage them to think deeply and arrive at solutions on their own.
- 2. Organizational Superheroes:** Suggest various organizational strategies to help them manage their time and tasks effectively. From color-coded calendars to to-do lists, find what works best for your child.
- 3. Set Boundaries for Success:** Help your child set clear boundaries for homework. A structured environment can make a world of difference in their productivity and well-being.

Our programs don't just teach academics but help students build essential organizational skills they'll rely on throughout their lives. With increasing academic demands and commitments, students learn to refine their techniques, becoming more adept at balancing multiple responsibilities. By the time they graduate, they possess a well-developed organizational toolkit that prepares them for the challenges of post-secondary education and life beyond school.

The ASM Graduate: Planning your education

Academia Stella Maris is registered as an independent school with the Ontario Ministry of Education (BSID 884149). ASM offers a unique educational experience for students K-12 with the option of an Ontario Ministry of Education inspected program for one's G12 year (OSSD). As you approach high school, it is important to plan ahead for your graduation goals. The chart below provides a general four-year picture of the courses offered at the high school level. The first four courses 1-4 (English, Math, Science and French) are offered according to the academic grade level of the student. The second four courses 5-8 (Art, PE, Geography, History, etc.) are offered on a four-year rolling schedule for all the high school students and catered to each individual's learning experience through assessments, expectations, homework and projects. Because ASM is a small school, our coursework is limited, but there is some variety allowed through TVO ilc. You can use this chart to plan your studies to ensure you will take the courses you need for your future study and working goals.

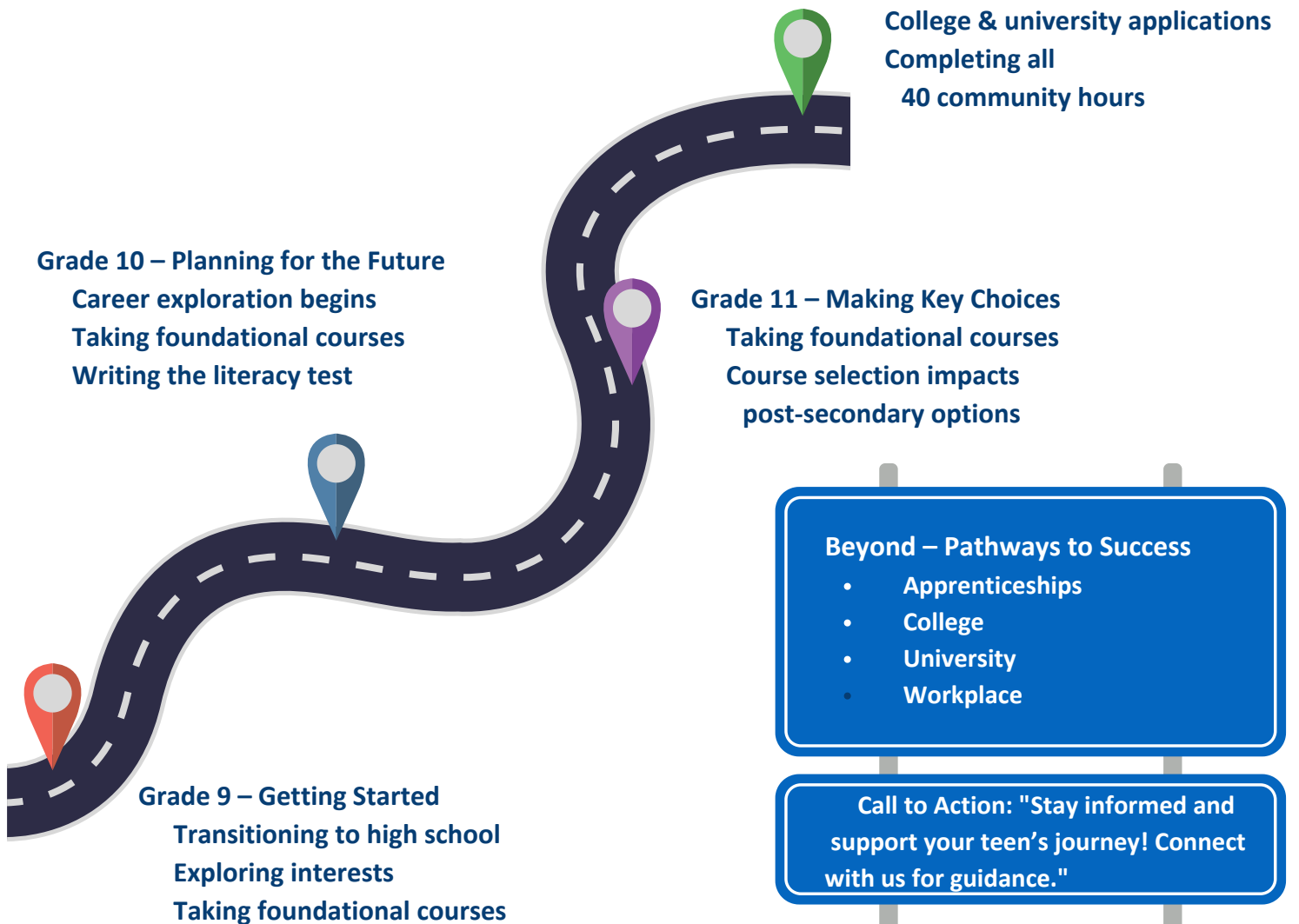
